










- Health care's climate footprint is equivalent to 4.4% of global net emissions (2 gigatons of carbon dioxide equivalent)
- Global health care climate footprint is equivalent to the annual greenhouse gas emissions from 514 coal-fired power plants
- If the health sector were a country, it would be the fifth-largest emitter on the planet

USA, China, India, Russia, Healthcare Sector, Japan, Brazil



- •Under a business-as-usual scenario health care's footprint will triple by 2050 reaching 6 gigatons per year.
- Meeting Paris Agreement commitments can reduce health care emissions growth by 70%
- •Through seven high-impact actions health care can reduce its emissions by 44 gigatons by 2050 and close in on zero emissions.
- •The sector can achieve decarbonization while ensuring greater health equity and climate justice between nations.

The Alliance for Transformative Action on Climate and Health (ATACH)

- Focus on climate-resilient, sustainable, low-carbon health care.
- WHO is Secretariat.
- Follows through on government health commitments in Glasgow (COP26 Health Programme).
- 62 low, middle and high-income governments have now joined. More than 20 have pledged net zero health care.
- Parallel commitment by G7.
- Argentina, Canada, EU, France, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, United States and United Kingdom have committed through ATACH or G7 declaration or both.
